



**MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN SCHOOL OF
GENERAL ADVOCACY OF THE UNION AND SYRACUSE
UNIVERSITY on behalf of its COLLEGE OF LAW**

Syracuse University (“SU”) on behalf of its College of Law, represented MICHELE G. WHEATLY, Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs and Provost and the Union through the Superior School of General Advocacy of the Union Ministro Victor Nunes Leal (“EAGU”), represented by Dra. CHIARA MICHELLE RAMOS MOURA DA SILVA, Directora of the School of General Advocacy of the Union (referred to singularly as a “Party” or collectively as the “Parties”) are entering into this Memorandum of Understanding (“MOU”) to facilitate discussions between them with respect to the establishment of a mutually beneficial relationship involving association with the *SU College of Law Masters in American Law Program* (the “LL.M. Program”).

CLAUSE ONE: EAGU and SU College of Law will establish a relationship with the ability to share this association in promotional materials, subject to the right of each Party to prior approval of any use of its name, trademarks or other intellectual property.

CLAUSE TWO: For a period of five (30) months (renewable at the consent of both Parties) SU College of Law will reserve a minimum of 2 and a maximum of 6 spaces in its LL.M. Program for individuals of EAGU (hereinafter known as “Sponsored Students”).

ITEM 1: In order to qualify as a Sponsored Student, the applicant will comport with all other admission requirements of the LL.M. Program, including submitting a full and complete application with all supporting materials. The applicant(s) must show proof of employment with EAGU prior to matriculation. SU reserves the right to reject or revoke an acceptance of a Sponsored Student if SU



determines, in its sole discretion, that his/her application or performance does not comport with SU's protocols or standards at any time.

ITEM 2: As Sponsored Students, applicants to the LL.M. Program will receive preferential and expeditious consideration during the admissions process. In addition, and where appropriate, Sponsored Students will receive endorsement by the SU College of Law for admission to the English Language Institute.

ITEM 3: Sponsored Students who are offered admission under this MOU will receive a 50% reduction in LL.M. Program tuition. Such tuition reduction can only be applied to LL.M. Program tuition during the academic year/term in which the applicant is admitted.

ITEM 4: Sponsored Students will be responsible for all costs of attendance, which may include, but are not limited to, tuition, students' living expenses, housing, health insurance, visas, transportation, as well as any ancillary and/or mandatory fees imposed by SU.

CLAUSE THREE: In the course of their engagement, the Parties may exchange information that could be confidential and not (a) generally known to the public, (b) already known, through legal means, to the Party receiving the information, or (c) legally obtained from a third party. Each Party agrees to use the other Party's confidential information solely for the purpose contemplated by this MOU and not to disclose such confidential information to any person or entity other than as necessary for such purposes.

CLAUSE FOUR: This MOU is a non-binding statement of the present intentions of the Parties and does not in and of itself create any responsibility or obligation of either Party, other than [(a)] an obligation to proceed in good faith to attempt to establish the programs described herein and [(b)] obligations of confidentiality and limited use of information and intellectual property as described above. Both Parties have the unilateral right to discontinue discussions at any time.

CLAUSE FIVE: This MOU may be changed or added by mutual agreement, evidenced by an amendment signed by both Parties. The amendment will be valid from the date of signature.

CLAUSE SIX: This MOU is valid from the date of the last signature and will be valid for five years, renewable with consent of both Parties.

CLAUSE SEVEN: This MOU does not represent exchange of money from the Parties.

ITEM 1: In case of expense, the proceeding for reimbursement should be part of specific instrument, which will follow the conditions provided in the law.

CLAUSE EIGHT: This MOU does not limit the Parties to celebrate similar agreements with other institutions.



This MOU may be executed in two or more counterparts, each of which shall be an original but all of which shall constitute one and the same instrument. The Parties agree to accept electronic, pdf and facsimile signatures as original signatures. Each Party's assent to this MOU is established by its signature below.
